Remarks:

1. If you are following the **dual** Bachelor or Associate degree **Chemical Engineering** study programme, an optional annual contribution of € 500 for study programmes offered in addition to the curriculum is required on top of the tuition fees. This means the total amount (including lecture notes) is € 2,271 or for the long learning scheme € 5,334.

2. Some study programmes offer the possibility to enrol as **external student**. Enrolling as external student only entitles the student to sit (preliminary) exams for the study programme for which an examination fee has been paid (article 7.36 of the Higher Education and Research Act). The annual examination fee is € 1,771.
